95TH ANNUAL CONVENTION OF WREU

The 95th Annual General Meeting of WREU was held at Junior Railway Institute ground, Ratlam from 16th to 17th November 2015.

Open Session

The Open Session, which was presided by Com. R. C. Sharma, was held in the afternoon of 16th November, 2015 at Junior Railway Institute. Com. Shiva Gopal Mishra, General Secretary/ AIRF, inaugurated the Open Session by lighting Lamp followed by other dignitaries present on the dais. Com. Rakhal Dasgupta, President/ AIRF, Com. C. A. Raja Shridhar, President HMS & Vice President, ITF, Com. Harbhajan Singh Siddhu, General Secretary/HMS, Shri G. C. Agrawal, General Manager, Western Railway, Com. Mukesh Mathur, General Secretary/ NWREU, Brother Mahendra Sharma, Ex. Regional Secretary, ITF (AP Region), Shri S. K. Albela, CPO (Admn.), Shri Manoj Sharma, DRM/RTM and Com. Dattaram Iswalkar, a prominent leader of Textile Workers Union in Mumbai, addressed the gathering. The Reception Committee welcomed all the dignitaries by garlanding them and presenting shawl and beautiful memento.

Com. Mishra in his inaugural speech appraised about NJCA's decision to postpone proposed Indefinite General Strike by Central Government employees w.e.f. 23rd November 2015 to somewhere in February 2016 during Budget session of Parliament on account of engineered delay in submission of the report of the Seventh CPC and a resolution to this effect was unanimously adopted in AIRF's 91st AGM held at Jodhpur. He strongly criticized the policies of the Government in allowing 100% FDI and PPP in Indian Railways and congratulated the rank and file of WREU for holding demonstrations and observing 'Protest Day' on the call of AIRF and NJCA. He mentioned about many achievements by AIRF including that of implementation of LARSGES Scheme, continuation of PLB with the bipartite formula, improvement in recommendations of the successive CPCs and its implementation, etc. He

appealed all to fight for protecting hard earned rights and facilities of the working class and the need of intensifying the struggle for achieving the legitimate demands of the Railwaymen.

General Manager in his speech praised the mature leadership of AIRF/WREU in protecting the rights of the Railwaymen and expressed happiness for the cordial industrial relations on Western Railway, thereby Western Railway could surpass the targets in passenger and freight earnings. He congratulated Women Wing of WREU for the successful conduct of the Women Conference. A beautiful Souvenir published on this occasion was released jointly by Com. Rakhal Dasgupta and the General Manager.

Com. Rakhal Dasgupta and Com. Harbhajan Singh Siddhu in their speeches also criticized pro-privatisation policies of the government and proposed amendment in labour laws to dilute the existing rights and benefits of the working class. Com Mukesh Mathur remembered Com. Umraomal Purohitji's contribution in getting implemented modified recommendations of 5th and 6th CPCs by which the Railwaymen were immensely benefited. He stated that NWREU feel proud being a part of WREU family.

Com. C. A. Raja Shridhar strongly criticized proprivatisation policies of the present government and allowing private stake holders on Indian Railways. While concluding the Open Session, Com. J.R. Bhosale read out messages received from various eminent personalities wishing the 95th Convention of WREU all success and thanked galaxy of leaders present on dais.

Delegate Session

Delegate Session was held in the Junior Railway Institute ground, Ratlam, at 10.00 hours on 17th November, 2015. Com. R. C. Sharma, President/ WREU, was in chair. After paying rich tribute to departed leaders and other comrades who left for heavenly abode since last AGM, by observing two minutes silence, Com. Bhosale placed the General Secretary's Report followed by Accounts by the Treasurer. Thereafter, following two Resolutions -(1) Charter of Demands; proposed by Com. M.R. Zaveri and seconded by Com. Nikhil Joshi, and (2) Problems of Railwaymen on Western Railway, proposed by Com. Prakash Savalkar and seconded by Com. H. S. Pal, were moved.

There were detailed deliberations on the Resolutions and General Secretary's Report. Following delegates participated in the deliberations, viz. S/Shri S. D. Meena, J.S. Vagaria, Sanjay Kapoor, Ravikant Baghel, Javid Haldarva, Rakesh Singh, Manohar Pachori, Bharat B. Mackwana, Alex Jacob, Sushant Bharti, Bhavesh Mehta, S.K. Shrivastava, Rakesh Mishra and Smt. Premlata Jain. General Secretary explained the various issues raised by the delegates and on his instance, Com. Sadhna Trivedi gave report on Women's Conference held on 16th November and informed about the resolution passed therein. Com Vivek Kambli and Miss. Geeta Pandoria elaborated activities of Youth and Women Wings, respectively and Com. Dinesh Panchal reported about T.U.E.P. and Non-bargaining activities conducted since last AGM. After deliberations. General Secretary's Report was adopted and Accounts for year ending 31.12.2014 was unanimously passed. Both the resolutions were unanimously passed. M/s. Ashok Dalal & Co., Chartered Accountant, was appointed as Auditors for the coming year.

While concluding, Com. President and General Secretary thanked all the distinguished guests, well-wishers, media personnel, decorators and caterers for their contribution in successful conduct of the Convention. They also thanked delegates, visitors and WREU activists for their active participation and co-operation. They also thanked Western Railway administration in general and DRM-RTM and divisional administration for their support and co-operation. Finally, they thanked Com. G.L. Sharma, Manohar Pachori, Shyambabu Shrivastava and their team of dedicated volunteers for excellent arrangements made for successful conduct of the Convention. The meeting was concluded with vote of thanks to the chair shouting loud slogans - "WREU-AIRF-HMS Zindabad - Kamgar Ekta Zindabad".

Savita Agrawal in her informative speech put forth the problems of women employees, their position in the society and with data, stress on the need of increasing their share in nation building. Com. Jaya Agarwal in her inspiring speech motivated the women employees by quoting various achievements by AIRF for working women. Com. Geeta Pandoria placed the activity report of Women Wings of WREU since last conference in a summarized way. A resolution was placed by Smt. Perin Sophia Harsh and was seconded by Smt. Anjali Korgaokar. Women Leaders from all divisions/ units participated in the discussion namely, Smt N. S. Hiwale, Yashoda Hegde, Prabha Patel, Pragnya Parmar, Rani Mathew, Preeti Joshi, Alka Agnihotri, Shabana Shaikh and Geeta Yadav. The resolution was adopted unanimously with shouting slogans 'Nari Sahkti Zindabad'. 'WREU/ AIRF/HMS/ITF Zindabad'. Smt. Sadhana Trivedi chaired the meeting. Smt. Premlata Jain anchored the programme.

SEVENTH CPC SUBMITS ITS REPORT

The 7th Central Pay Commission has submitted its report to Shri Arun Jaitely, Hon'ble Finance Minister of India on 19th November 2015. The report was not up to the expectations. Apart from the fact that there is no sizable increase in the salary, around 52 allowances are abolished and HRA is decreased from the present 30, 20 and 10% to 24, 16 and 8% for 'X', 'Y' and 'Z' class cities. Instead of removing the existing anomalies in the MACPS, the Pay Commission has introduced passing of examination as another criteria for granting MACP benefit and Benchmark changed from 'Good' to 'Very good' for MACPS. The Pay Commission has recommended that Annual Increment of employees whose performance is not "Very Good" be stopped after 20 years of service and he may be allowed to opt for Voluntary Retirement. Further, CPC has recommended for introduction of "Performance Related Pay" (PRP) and that the existing PLB Scheme should be subsumed under PRP. Further, the demand of Duty Specific Special Allowances for categories of Technical Supervisors of P. Way, Works, Bridges & Track Machines and Risk Allowance for Technical Supervisors has not been considered. In case of Child Care Leave for women employees, leave wage shall be reduced to 80% for second spell of 365 days CCL. The Commission has also refused to make any recommendation against the NPS. National JCA and AIRF has strongly protested against the retrograde recommendations of the 7th CPC and has called for observing Black Day on 27th November and protest meetings and massive demonstrations to show the anguish of the Railwaymen against such retrograde recommendations. The following are some of the highlights of the recommendations:

- 1) Recommendations will be implemented from 01.01.2016.
- Minimum pay Rs.18,000/- & Maximum Rs.2.25 Lakh; Rs.2.50 Lakh for Cabinet Secretary; 3% annual increment; Actual hike in salary 14.29%; 23.55% increase in overall salary when taking in to account increase in allowances. Grade Pay System and 52 allowances abolished.
- 3) The fitment of employee in the new pay matrix is proposed to be done by multiplying his/her basic pay on the date of implementation by a factor of 2.57. The figure so arrived at is to be located in the new pay matrix.
- 4) Pay fixation example: In case an employee is drawing basic pay of Rs. 24,200 in PB-2, i.e. Basic 20,000 + GP Rs.4200, his salary would be fixed by multiplying basic pay by 2.57, which amounts to Rs. 62,194/- and would be placed at Level 6 in the Pay Matrix.
- 5) On promotion, first add one increment in existing pay and horizontally pay fixed to the nearest, next higher figure in the column of figures for next level.
- 6) Departmental Exam & training for MACPS in 10, 20 and 30 years of service and Benchmark changed from 'Good' to 'Very good' & regular fixation as on promotion.
- 7) The Commission recommended for continuance of existing formula and calculation of DA
- 8) 24% Hike in Pension.
- 9) One Rank One Pension (OROP) proposed for retired Govt. employees.
- 10) Gratuity is enhanced from Rs.10 Lakh to 20 Lakh and ceiling on Gratuity to be raised by 25% for every increase of DA by 50%.
- 11) **Revised rates for payment of death gratuity:** Length of Service less than one year Rate of Death Gratuity 2 times of monthly emoluments; Length of Service One year or more but less than 5 years Rate of Death Gratuity 6 times of monthly emoluments ; Length of Service 5 years or more but less than 20 yrs Rate of Death Gratuity 12 times of monthly emoluments ; Length of Service 20 years or more Rate of Death Gratuity 12 times of monthly emoluments; Half month of emoluments for every complete six monthly period of qualifying service subject to a maximum of 33 times of emoluments.
- 12) House Rent Allowance reduced from the

present 30, 20 and 10% to 24, 16 and 8% respectively for 'X', 'Y' and 'Z' class cities. HRA will be raised to 27, 18, and 9% when DA increases to 50% and further raised to 30, 20 and 10% when DA increases to 100%.

- 13) **Night Duty Allowance:** Present system of weightage retained.
- 14) **NHA** rates increased by 1.5% and it will increase by 25% whenever DA raised by 50%.

- 15) Over Time Allowance abolished. However retained for Operating and Industrial Employees governed by statutory provisions.
- 16) Uniform Allowance renamed as Dress Allowance and it will be payable annually. Station Masters will get Dress Allowance @ Rs.10,000 p.a. and others eligible employees will get Rs.5,000 p.a.
- 17) **Commercial:** TC in GP Rs.1900 upgraded to Rs.2000 and those in GP Rs.2400 upgraded to Rs.2800. Recommended for merger of cadre of TC, ECRC and Booking staff.
- 18) Accounts Dept: Sr.SO in GP Rs.4800 will be placed in GP Rs.5400 after completion of 4 years.
- 19) Breakdown Allowance abolished.
- 20) **Training Allowance:** Reduced from existing 30% to 24% in case of National level Training Centres & for the remaining from 15% to 12%.
- 21) Non Practicing Allowance payable to Doctors reduced from 25% to 20%.
- 22) **Composite Transfer Grant** reduced from 100% of the basic pay to 80%.
- 23) **Children Education Allowance:** Rs.2250 p.m. and will be paid once a year after production of certificate from School/College. Hostel Subsidy @ Rs.6750 p.m. or actual.
- 24) Family Planning Allowance abolished.
- 25) All interest free advances abolished.
- 26) Interest bearing advances:-PC Advance-50000/or actual price (may be allowed maximum 05 times in entire service.)
- 27) **House Building Advance:** 34 times of basic pay or Rs.25 Lakh or anticipated cost of House whichever is less.

- 30) Introduced Special Train Controller Allowance @ rate of Rs.5000/- p.m. to Section Controllers and Dy. Chief Controllers. This Allowance will be increased by 25% on DA raises by 50% each time.
- 31) Station Masters in GP Rs.2800 will be upgraded to GP 4200 first on 1.1.2016 and then fixation formula will be applied. Recommended abolition of ASM designation.
- 32) Additional Allowance has renamed as **Special Running Staff Allowance** to Running Staff.

WREU OBSERVED 'PROTEST DAY'

As per the unanimous decision taken in the 91st Annual Convention of AIRF held at Jodhpur from 3-5 October, 2015, to observe 19th November, 2015 as "Protest Day" all over Indian Railways to press upon the major demands, viz. (i) Undue delay in publishing the report of the VII CPC; (ii) Scrap proposal of inducting FDI/ PPP in the Railways; (iii) Scrap NPS and cover all the Railwaymen under Guaranteed Pension/ Family Pension irrespective of appointment in Railways; (iv) Remove ceiling of Rs.3500 p.m. for computing PLB to Railwaymen; (v) Scrap report of High Level Railway Restructuring Committee; (v) Resolve all the long pending outstanding demands of the Railwaymen, etc., WREU cadre all over Western Railway observed Protest Day by holding dharnas, meetings and demonstrations at Unit, Divisional and Zonal Headquarters and also at important stations, as under:

Zonal HQ Office, Churchgate: A gate meeting was held at GM's Office Lawn during lunch

hours, which was attended by large number of Railwaymen from BCT Division, PL-MX Workshops, Printing Press, Stores, EMU-POH/ MX and Churchgate GLO and Accounts Offices. Com. J.R. Bhosale while addressing the gathering criticized the government for allowing 100% FDI and PPP on Indian Railways and Defence and dwelt on the charter of demands submitted by NJCA. He stated that 7th CPC is about to submit its report today and NICA will continue with its agitations till all the demands mentioned in the Charter of Demands are resolved. Com. R.K. Singh criticized the government on allowing 100% FDI in Defence Sector and also on skyrocketing prices of essential commodities. Com. Prashant Kanade also addressed the meeting and Com. P.B. Bhargava conveyed vote of thanks. Com. Nasir Shaikh, Vice President/WREU & Secretary, GLO-CCG Branch and Com. Unnikrishnan, Secretary, Accounts Branch along with their comrades made necessary arrangements.

BRC Division: Around 300 employees participated in protest meeting organized at TRS Shed BRCY on 19.11.2015. Com. Santosh Pawar, Sanjay Pawar, Rajesh Maurya explained the background of observing of protest day.

A mass dharna was organized by **WREU-Rajkot** on 19.11.2015 at DRM Office-RJT, in which more than 400 employees participated. Com. Mahesh K. Chhaya and Com. Nikhil Joshi explained core issues and the pro-privatisation policies of the government.

In **Bhavnagar Division**, protest meetings were organized at DRM Office, BVP BG work shop, DLJ, JND, JLR, GDL, VRL and many other branches.

Ratlam Division: WREU-RTM observed protest day by holding demonstrations and by conducting Gate Meetings at various places. The demonstration held at Ujjain Station was addressed by Comrades S/Shri Govindlal Sharma, S. B. Shrivastava, S. S. Sharma, Ravindra Upadhyay and Mohd. Afzal. The leaders in their address briefly explained about the pending demands, resolutions adopted in the AIRF and WREU conventions and stated that if needed be ready to intensify the struggle including that of direct action of indefinite strike. At Mhow led by Com. Jitendra Jaiswal and Pradeep Tiwari, all the local branches held demonstration in front of the office of Station Manager. At Indore undr the leadership of Com. National JCA in its meeting held on 20th November 2015 directed all the constituents of NJCA and their affiliates to hold massive demonstrations, bearing black badges, on 27th November, 2015, against the retrograde recommendations of the VII CPC. As per the call of NJCA and AIRF, WREU observed Black Day on 27th November, 2015 and distributed Handbills/ Leaflets on the shortcomings of the 7th CPC report and pinned black badges/black ribbons on dress of each and every employee.

Mumbai Division: A massive protest meeting was organized during lunch hours on 27th November, in front of DRM Office, Mumbai Central, in which more than 800 employees, wearing red shirt and black badges participated. Com. Prashant Kanade, Nasir Shaikh, R. P. Gupta, Prakash Savalkar, Jintendra Singh, Rajan P. and Smt. N.S. Hiwale addressed the gathering and mentioned about the retrograde recommendations of the 7th CPC and exhorted them to be ready for direct action if these recommendations are not improved.

A gate meeting was held at **EMU POH Workshop**, Mahalaxmi, which was attended by hundreds of workers from EMU POH, Parel Workshop, Printing Press and Stores/MX with black ribbon tied up to their dresses. Com. Vikas Gupte, P.B. Bhargava, Abhishek Bhargav, Sanjay Girkar and Praful Jamsandekar addressed the meeting.

Vadodara Division: Protest meeting was held during lunch hours at DRM Office Pratapnagar. Comrade Santosh Pawar, R. S. Singh, Vinod Manjarawala, Smt Sadhana Trivedi gave their views on the report of the 7th CPC and its shortcomings and called upon the large number of employees present in the meeting to be ready for direct action. After the protest meeting, the participants marched in a rally through DRM office and Railway Hospital, Pratapnagar. Ahmedabad Division: Protest meetings were held at DRM-ADI Office, Ahmedabad Railway Station, Sabarmati Workshops, Vatva Diesel Shed, Kankaria, Viramgam, Dhangadhra, Malia, Radhanpur, Kalol, Mehsana, Palanpur, Himmatnagar, Gandhidham and Comrades R.C. In the morning, Divisional and Branch office bearers met each and every employee at their work place and distributed leaflets and pinned up black ribbons.

A book written by Shri Viswas Patil on Textile Mill Workers Indefinite Strike led by Late Dr. Datta Samant and published by Rajhans Publications was released by the hands of Shri Anil Purushottam Kakodkar, a prominent Scientist, on 8th November 2015 in Bharat Mata Cinema Theatre. A well-known Labour Advocate & Retired Chief Justice of Supreme Court Shri Hemant Gokhale was the Chief Guest. S/Shri Datta Iswalkar, Dada Samant, Suresh Patil, Sadanand Godse, Ramji Tiwari, Ashok Bagve, Badkamkar, Damodar Madhav, Anwar Hussain, Waman Kendre (famous Film Director) and many other prominent labour leaders and social workers were present on the occasion. The book contains about 18th January 1982 Textile Mill Workers Indefinite Strike led by Late Dr. Datta Samant and how the Textile Workers fought

and overcome number of problems caused by Indefinite Strike. Many of the speakers mentioned that the indefinite strike of Textile Workers was successful but it was broken by the Mill owners and Government at that time. Some speakers mentioned that Bombay is a Nursery of Marathi language.

Shri Hemant Gokhale mentioned that the present trade union movement in the country had failed to stop the present government from carrying out various anti-labour amendments to number of labour laws. All speakers congratulated Shri Viswas Patil for his book in bringing the situation faced by the textile workers of Lalbaug and Parel area and their families. Mrs. Viswas Patil was also honoured for pain taken by her in proof reading and supporting Shri Viswas Patil in bringing out this work. Com. Mahesh Keluskar anchored the whole programme.

RATES OF ALLIED RUNNING ALLOWANCES INCREASED

The rates of Allowance in Lieu of Running Room Facilities, Shunting Duty Allowance, Trip Allowance and Commercial Duty Allowance were increased by 25% w.e.f. 01.01.2011 consequent upon increase of Dearness Allowance to 51%.

WREU/AIRF raised the demand for its revision subsequent to enhancement in the rates of Dearness Allowance to 100% w.e.f. 01.01.2014 vide their letters No. AIRF/BCT/09/2015 dated 18th May 2015. Railway Board has accordingly revised the rates of these Allowances and increase by further 25% w.e.f. 01.01.2014 over the rates laid down vide Board's letter No. E(P&A)II-2015/ RS-34 dt.01.10.2009.
